

 - Develop Community Agrosecurity Planning (CAP) Teams to establish or enhance agrosecurity components within existing local emergency operations plans (EOPs)








Based on the counties/jurisdictions represented at workshops conducted from 2009 through today...

18.4 million inhabitants are more protected from negative effects of an agricultural disaster.


Participant Diversity



Level of Expertise






