Table III – States and Federal Lands

States and Federal Lands receive an allocation based on their quartile rank in two variables correlated with the need for veterinary services: 1) Livestock and Livestock Products Total Sales (LLPTS) and 2) Approximate Land Area (LA), as reported by the National Agriculture Statistics Service (NASS). The total number of allowed nominations per program cycle for a State (shown in Table IV) corresponds to the sum of nominations allocated based on quartile rank of LLPTS and LA shown below. Values and variables and quartile rank are correlated and shown in ascending order.
